Welcome to the 2022-23 AP (Advanced Placement) Program. AP testing will take place May 1 – 5 and May 8 – 12, 2023, but students must register now in order to take the test next spring. Please complete the following instructions to get yourself registered to take your AP test(s).

Register by “joining” your AP teachers class section. Your AP teachers will require you to log onto [myap.collegeboard.org](https://myap.collegeboard.org) (a personalized homepage with AP information, resources, and tolls) and enroll in their AP class sections. Each AP class has its own “join code”. Your AP teacher has already been communicating with you about this and should have supplied you with their AP join code. [Sign in to My AP](#) with your College Board account and make sure you’ve joined your class section(s). If you haven’t, you’ll need to follow the steps to [join your section online](#). If you don’t already have an account, please sign up at <https://collegeboard.org/register>

Joining an AP class section will give you access to new instructional resources including interactive quizzes, individualized progress checks, a bank of real AP questions, and other new digital tools. Hopefully, you will feel more supported as you move through your AP course, and gain confidence as you prepare for the exam.

“Joining” an AP class section automatically places an order for an AP exam for you. You can’t pay for your exam on the College Board website. Testing fees will be collected at the THS ASB Office. The cost per each exam is \$97.
