Graduation data

Adjusted 4-Year Cohort Graduation Rate: 88.2%
This rate represents only those students with an expected graduation year of 2017. These students would have started grade 9 in the fall of 2013 and were expected to graduate "on time" (in four years).

Adjusted 5-Year Cohort Graduation Rate: 92.6%
This rate includes students who graduated after their expected graduation year. Late graduates are added to the total number of on-time graduates in the year they graduate when calculating the extended rate.

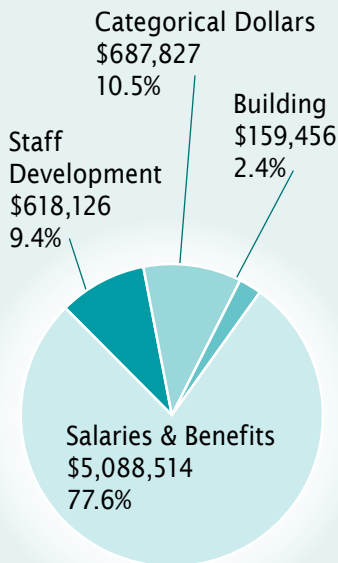
