We prioritize the use of site resources in order to align the curriculum and complete our School Improvement Plan. We coordinate our staff development with District staff development to effectively use precious resources.

East Olympia Elementary, constructed in 1989, is situated on 20 acres at 8700 Rich Road S.E. It houses kindergarten through sixth grade and has a capacity of 550 students. The current facility is 43,583 square feet and contains 25 classrooms, including three portables.

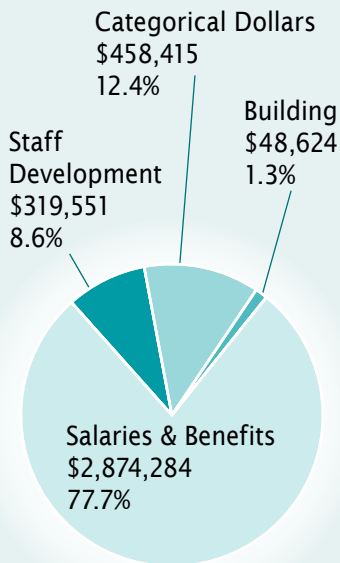
