East Olympia is a community of learners where each individual is treated with dignity and respect. Classrooms are implementing the Sanford Harmony Social Emotional curriculum to provide supports and interventions to address barriers to learning and academic success. All of our classrooms provide learning environments where children can grow and develop into responsible, successful, participating citizens. We emphasize reading, writing and math improvement at EOE. Each grade level created equity goals to address specific concerns for their students. A Spanish class is in the pilot year for first and second grade students. East Olympia Elementary was constructed in 1989. A ten million dollar remodel was completed in February of 2019. Many safety concerns were addressed in the remodel. It is situated on 20 acres at 8700 Rich Road S.E. It houses kindergarten through fifth grade. The current facility is 43,583 square feet and contains 30 classrooms, including eight portables.

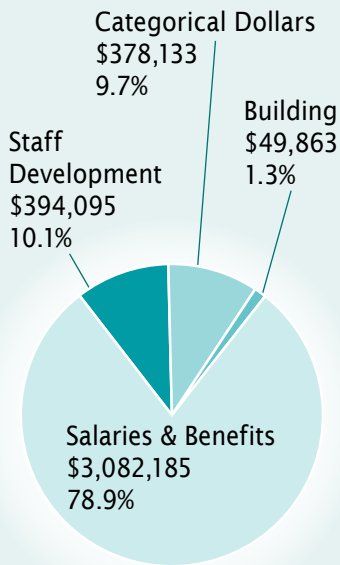
