The original facility, situated on 11 acres at 12710 Littlerock Road SW, was constructed in 1912. Extensive additions, remodeling and renovations were done in 1977, 1985 and 1992. In 2000, LRE increased its size by 3.52 additional acres and 40,118 square feet. Seismic upgrade and modernization was done in 2003-04. With 9 portables, Littlerock has a total of 28 classrooms. Passage of a local bond in 2014 will lead to modernization and partial replacement of Littlerock's buildings. Work is scheduled to be completed by September, 2017.

At LRE we emphasize the teaching of Common Core State Standards so students can enter each grade level with the learning tools to be successful. Beyond high expectations in the classroom, each child receives daily support in reading and mathematics through our Response to Intervention (RTI) which reaches low to high performing students. Through our school-wide behavior management program, Positive Behavior Management System (PBIS), our students are recognized frequently via "Tiger Paws" and at monthly assemblies in many areas, such as: academic achievement, academic improvement, attitude, and being safe, respectful, responsible, and kind. LRE provides a full complement of educational services including, but not limited to: Drama Club, Reading Club, Accelerated Reader, Music, Band, Orchestra, one hard-wired computer lab, 4 mobile computer labs, and Foss Science Kits.

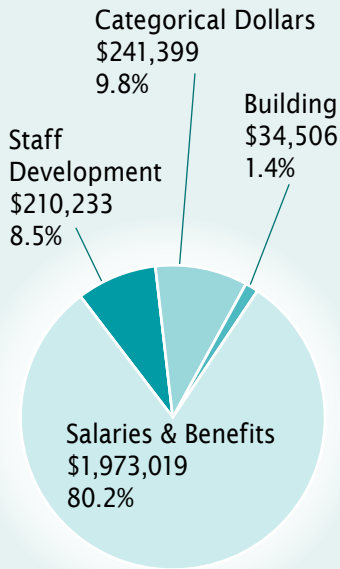
