Tumwater Middle School is located at 6335 Littlerock Road. The almost 100,000 square foot facility serves over 700 students in grades 6, 7 and 8, with an administration and cafeteria/commons buildings, three classroom buildings which house 37 classrooms, and two gymnasiums. The front office provides an efficient area to serve students, parents, and visitors. In addition, musicians are enjoying the Music Learning Center, complete with practice rooms, separate instrument storage room, and office space for instructors. In our most recent modernization in 2017, improvements were made to the main building including our office area, counseling center, library, kitchen, with upgrades in heating, lighting, and technology systems. Additionally, a new classroom building and gymnasium was constructed to house students as TMS transitioned from a 7/8th school to a 6/7/8 Middle School. Existing science classrooms on campus were modernized and common spaces in each classroom building were designed for break-out instructional spaces.

Students participate in six classes each day with an emphasis on core skill development: language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, and physical education/ health classes. In addition, students choose from a variety of fine arts and exploratory classes including: band, choir, orchestra, art, leadership, science

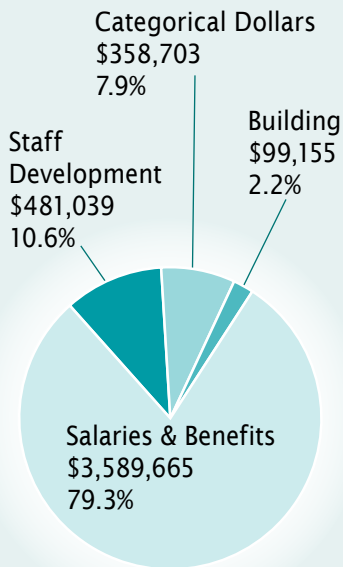
